SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 3 Article – Environment

- 4 4–102.
- (A) The provisions of this subtitle do not apply to agricultural land management practices, construction of agricultural structures, CEMETERIES LOCATED IN CHARLES COUNTY, or, except in Calvert County, to construction of single–family residences or their accessory buildings that disturb an area of less than one—half acre and occur on lots of two acres or more.
- 10 **(B)** Regardless of planning, zoning, or subdivision controls, a county or municipality may not issue a permit for grading or construction of any building, other than those matters exempted by the provisions of this section, unless the grading or construction conforms with plans approved as provided in this subtitle.
- 14 4–204.
- (a) (1) [After July 1, 1984,] EXCEPT FOR LAND DEVELOPED FOR USE AS A CEMETERY IN CHARLES COUNTY OR unless OTHERWISE exempted, AFTER JULY 1, 1984, a person may not develop any land for residential, commercial, industrial, or institutional use without submitting a stormwater management plan to the county or municipality that has jurisdiction, and obtaining approval of the plan from the county or municipality.
- 21 **(2)** A grading or building permit may not be issued for a property unless a 22 stormwater management plan has been approved that is consistent with this subtitle.

- 25 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle shall apply to 26 any public or private subdivision plan or application for a grading or sediment control 27 permit by any person, including a unit of State or local government on areas 40,000 square 28 feet or greater.
- 29 (b) The provisions of this subtitle do not apply to:
- 30 (12) Any stream restoration project for which the applicant for a grading or 31 sediment control permit has executed a binding maintenance agreement of at least 5 years 32 with the affected property owner; [and]
  - (13) Maintenance or retrofitting of a stormwater management structure

- 1 that may include clearing of vegetation or removal and trimming of trees, so long as the
- 2 maintenance or retrofitting is within the original limits of disturbance for construction of
- 3 the existing structure, or within any maintenance easement for access to the structure;

- 5 (14) THE DEVELOPMENT OF LAND FOR USE AS A CEMETERY IN 6 CHARLES COUNTY.
