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Good Job Opportunities for High School Graduates Act of 2021

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain county boards of education to consider the pursuit of 4 certain certificates, certifications, or apprenticeships as the equivalent of pursuing 5 postsecondary education; authorizing certain individuals to release certain student 6 information to certain apprenticeship sponsors and employers; requiring certain 7 public high schools to inform students of certain employment and skills training 8 opportunities in a certain manner through certain apprenticeship sponsors and 9 employers; requiring a county board to pay for a certain student to take certain 10 exams under certain circumstances; providing for the purpose of the Career and 11 Technology Education Innovation Grant during certain fiscal years; altering the 12 information to be included in a certain application; requiring, in certain fiscal years, 13 a local workforce development board to make a certain demonstration to the State 14 Department of Education to receive a certain grant; repealing certain obsolete 15 provisions of law; making conforming changes; defining certain terms; making 16 certain provisions of this Act subject to a certain contingency; providing for the 17 termination of certain provisions of this Act under a certain circumstance; and 18 generally relating to career education in public schools.

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
