A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Department of Agriculture – Urban Agriculture Grant Program

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Urban Agriculture Grant Program in the Department 4 of Agriculture; establishing an Urban Agriculture Grant Fund; establishing the $\mathbf{5}$ purpose of the Program and Fund; requiring the Secretary of Agriculture to 6 administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the 7 Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; requiring 8 the Fund to be used to provide certain grants under certain circumstances; establishing certain qualifications for certain nonprofit organizations to receive a 9 certain grant under the Program; requiring certain grant recipients to report certain 10 11 information to the Department; requiring the Department to adopt certain 12regulations to administer the Fund; requiring the establishment of a certain Review 13 Board; requiring the Board to provide grants from money available in the Fund; 14authorizing the Department to appoint certain members to the Board; requiring the 15Board to include certain representatives; requiring a certain percentage of certain 16 grant amounts to have certain purposes; requiring certain grants to have a certain 17measurable impact; authorizing certain abandoned property funds to be distributed 18 in certain fiscal years to the Fund; authorizing the Department to adopt certain 19regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Urban Agriculture 20Grant Program in the Department of Agriculture.

11 (A) A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION IS QUALIFIED TO RECEIVE A GRANT IN 12 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES THAT THE 13 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION:

14(1) IS INCORPORATED OR MAINTAINS ITS PRINCIPAL PLACE OF15BUSINESS IN BALTIMORE CITY; AND

16(2)WORKS TO INCREASE THE VIABILITY OF URBAN FARMING AND17IMPROVE ACCESS TO URBAN-GROWN FOODS.

18 **(B)** WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE END OF A GRANT CYCLE, A QUALIFIED 19 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT RECEIVED A GRANT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS 20 SUBTITLE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT INCLUDES THE 21 FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

22 (1) THE NAMES AND LOCATIONS OF URBAN AGRICULTURAL 23 PRODUCERS THAT RECEIVED FUNDS UNDER THE PROGRAM;

24 (2) THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF FUNDS AWARDED TO EACH URBAN 25 AGRICULTURAL PRODUCER; AND

26(3)THE IMPACT OF THE PROGRAM ON INCREASING THE VIABILITY OF27URBAN FARMING AND IMPROVING ACCESS TO URBAN–GROWN FOODS.

29 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 2–2003(G) OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE DEPARTMENT 30 MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS SUBTITLE.

Article – Commercial Law

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1 17-317.

2 (a) (1) All funds received under this title, including the proceeds of the sale of 3 abandoned property under § 17–316 of this subtitle, shall be credited by the Administrator 4 to a special fund. The Administrator shall retain in the special fund at the end of each fiscal 5 year, from the proceeds received, an amount not to exceed \$50,000, from which sum the 6 Administrator shall pay any claim allowed under this title.

7 (2) After deducting all costs incurred in administering this title from the 8 remaining net funds, the Administrator:

9 (I) shall distribute \$2,000,000 to the Maryland Legal Services 10 Corporation Fund established under § 11–402 of the Human Services Article; AND

11 (II) MAY DISTRIBUTE UP TO \$400,000 TO THE URBAN 12 AGRICULTURE GRANT FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 2–2003 OF THE AGRICULTURE 13 ARTICLE, FOR EACH OF FISCAL YEARS 2023 THROUGH 2026.

(3) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the Administrator
shall distribute all unclaimed money from judgments of restitution under Title 11, Subtitle
6 of the Criminal Procedure Article to the State Victims of Crime Fund established under
§ 11–916 of the Criminal Procedure Article to assist victims of crimes and delinquent acts
to protect the victims' rights as provided by law.

19 (ii) If a victim entitled to restitution that has been treated as 20 abandoned property under § 11–614 of the Criminal Procedure Article is located after the 21 money has been distributed under this paragraph, the Administrator shall reduce the next 22 distribution to the State Victims of Crime Fund by the amount recovered by the victim.

(4) After making the distributions required under paragraphs (2) and (3)
of this subsection, the Administrator shall distribute the remaining net funds not retained
under paragraph (1) of this subsection to the General Fund of the State.

(b) Before making the distribution, the Administrator shall record the name and last known address, if any, of the owners of funds so distributed and the type of property which the funds distributed represent. The record shall be available for public inspection during reasonable business hours by any person who claims a legal interest in any property held by the Administrator, provided that the person gives prior notice to the Administrator.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
 1, 2021.
