1 AN ACT concerning

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Growing Family Child Care Opportunities Pilot Program – Established

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Growing Family Child Care Opportunities Pilot 4 Program in the State Department of Education; stating the purpose of the Program; 5 requiring the Department to administer the Program in partnership with a certain 6 entity; requiring the Department to award certain grants to certain recipients; 7 requiring grant recipients to use the grants for certain purposes; requiring grant 8 recipients to raise certain funding, collaborate with certain providers during a 9 certain period, provide certain services, and establish certain partnerships for certain purposes; requiring the Governor, in certain fiscal years, to include in the 10 11 annual budget bill a certain appropriation for the Program; requiring the 12 Department to develop certain guidelines in partnership with a certain entity; 13 authorizing the Department to seek funding for the Program and to provide grants 14 as soon as possible under a certain circumstance; requiring the Department to develop and publish goals for the Program each year; requiring the Department to 15 16 submit a certain report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date of each year; defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 17 18 relating to the Growing Family Child Care Opportunities Pilot Program.
