1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Nursing – Certified Nursing Assistant Advisory Committee –**
3 **Membership and Meetings**

4 FOR the purpose of increasing the number of alternates that the State Board of Nursing is
5 required to appoint for certain members of the Certified Nursing Assistant Advisory
6 Committee; establishing certain qualifications for members of the advisory
7 committee; providing that, at the end of a term, a member of the advisory committee
8 continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualified; providing that a
9 certain member of the advisory committee serves only for a certain period and until
10 a successor is appointed and qualifies; prohibiting a member of the advisory
11 committee from serving more than a certain number of terms; requiring the State
12 Board to fill a certain vacancy within a certain period of time, to the extent
13 practicable; altering the meeting requirements for the advisory committee;
14 establishing a requirement for quorum of the advisory committee; making a stylistic
15 change; and generally relating to the Certified Nursing Assistant Advisory
16 Committee.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
23 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Health Occupations

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2 8–6A–13.

3 (a) The Board shall appoint an advisory committee consisting of at least 15
4 members.

5 (b) Of the 15 committee members:

6 (1) Six shall be nursing assistants:

7 (i) One shall be an acute care nursing assistant;

8 (ii) One shall be a home care nursing assistant;

9 (iii) One shall be a long–term care nursing assistant;

10 (iv) One shall be an adult medical day care nursing assistant;

11 (v) At least one of the nursing assistant members shall be a member
12 of a union; and

13 (vi) One shall be an independent contractor;

14 (2) Three shall be registered nurses:

15 (i) One shall be an acute care registered nurse;

16 (ii) One shall be a home care registered nurse; and

17 (iii) One shall be a long–term care registered nurse;

18 (3) One shall be an administrator from a licensed health care facility;

19 (4) One shall be a licensed practical nurse;

20 (5) One shall be an individual who teaches a nursing assistant course;

21 (6) One shall be a consumer member who has received care, or has a family
22 member who has received care from a nursing assistant;

23 (7) One shall be a representative of the Department; and

24 (8) One shall be a certified medication technician.

25 (c) The Board shall appoint an alternate for each of the [three] **SIX** nursing

1 assistant members in the event that the nursing assistant member is unable to discharge
2 the duties of the committee.

3 (D) EACH MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE MUST:

4 (1) BE A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES;

5 (2) BE A RESIDENT OF THE STATE; AND

6 (3) HAVE PRACTICED IN THE MEMBER'S HEALTH OCCUPATION FOR
7 AT LEAST 5 YEARS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE MEMBER'S APPOINTMENT.

8 [(d)] (E) (1) [An advisory committee member shall serve a] THE term of AN
9 ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEMBER IS 4 years.

10 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL
11 A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

12 (3) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
13 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
14 QUALIFIES.

15 (4) A MEMBER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE FULL
16 TERMS.

17 (5) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE BOARD SHALL FILL ANY
18 VACANCY ON THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF THE
19 VACANCY.

20 [(e)] (F) (1) [The] IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER MEETING
21 REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS TITLE, THE advisory committee shall meet [at least once
22 a month]:

23 (I) AT LEAST ONCE A MONTH; AND

24 (II) AT THE REQUEST OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE
25 BOARD.

26 (2) A MAJORITY OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP OF THE ADVISORY
27 COMMITTEE IS A QUORUM.

28 [(f)] (G) The advisory committee shall:

29 (1) Evaluate training programs and make recommendations for approval

1 by the Board;

2 (2) Develop and recommend regulations to enforce the provisions of this
3 subtitle;

4 (3) Evaluate candidates as required and recommend action to the Board;

5 (4) Review investigations of complaints against nursing assistants or
6 medication technicians and make recommendations to the Board for disciplinary action;

7 (5) Keep a record of its proceedings; and

8 (6) Submit an annual report to the Board.

9 **[(g)] (H)** A member of the advisory committee is entitled to receive:

10 (1) Compensation, as determined by the Board; and

11 (2) Reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel
12 Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

13 **[(h)]** A member who is appointed after a term has begun may serve one additional
14 full term.]

15 (i) The Board may remove a member:

16 (1) For incompetence or misconduct; or

17 (2) Who is absent from two successive committee meetings without
18 adequate reason.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
20 October 1, 2021.
