

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- 1 29–101. 2 In this title the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) "Alternative dispute resolution" includes mediation. 3 (b) "Commission" means: 4 (c) **(I)** the St. Mary's County Human Relations Commission; OR 5 6 (II)A HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION IN A CODE HOME RULE COUNTY OF THE SOUTHERN MARYLAND CLASS. 7 "COUNTY COMMISSIONERS" MEANS THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF 8 St. Mary's County or the county commissioners of a code home rule 9 COUNTY OF THE SOUTHERN MARYLAND CLASS. 10 11 29-101.1. 1 (b) [The] A Commission shall:

- 2 (1) use its influence and persuasion to direct the efforts of the community 3 to solving problems that many times are the basic reasons for racial tensions; and
- 4 (2) encourage and ensure equal treatment of all people, without regard to race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, age, marital status, or physical or mental disability, in compliance with federal, State, and local laws and regulations related to housing, employment, and public accommodations.

- 9 (a) A person seeking an alternative dispute resolution under this title shall file a written request for alternative dispute resolution within 6 months after the date of the incident giving rise to the request.
- 12 (b) (1) A person who satisfies the time requirements under subsection (a) of 13 this section is deemed to have complied with the requirements of § 20–1004 of the State 14 Government Article.
- 15 (2) [The] A Commission may provide a copy of a written request filed under 16 subsection (a) of this section to the Maryland Commission on Human Relations to verify 17 the compliance of a party with the requirements of § 20–1004 of the State Government 18 Article.

- 20 (a) This section supersedes any contrary provision of the Public Information Act 21 [and], the St. Mary's County Open Meetings Act, AND ANY COMPARABLE LOCAL LAW.
- 22 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection:
- 23 (i) all activities of [the] A Commission that relate to an alternative 24 dispute resolution, a grievance, or a complaint of discrimination shall be conducted in 25 confidence and without publicity; and
- 26 (ii) [the] A Commission may meet in closed session when dealing with an alternative dispute resolution, a grievance, or a complaint of discrimination.
- 28 (2) If all parties involved in an alternative dispute resolution, a grievance, 29 or a complaint of discrimination consent in writing, the activities of [the] A Commission 30 related to the alternative dispute resolution, grievance, or complaint of discrimination may 31 be conducted publicly.
- 32 (3) Except as provided under § 29–107 of this title, [the] A Commission 33 shall hold confidential all information concerning an alternative dispute resolution, a

- 1 grievance, or a complaint of discrimination, including the identities of the parties involved.
- 2 (4) [The] IN ST. MARY'S COUNTY, THE Commission shall hold confidential any information and records obtained by a predecessor county body that was authorized to perform a function similar to that of the Commission before July 1, 1997.
- 5 (c) (1) Information related to the activities or involvement of [the] A 6 Commission in an alternative dispute resolution, a grievance, or a complaint of 7 discrimination may not be admitted as evidence in any administrative proceeding or 8 litigation.
- 9 (2) The records of [the] A Commission may not be discovered in any 10 administrative proceeding or litigation.
- (d) (1) Except as provided under § 29–107 of this title and paragraph (2) of this subsection, information or records related to the activities or involvement of [the] A Commission in an alternative dispute resolution, a grievance, or a complaint of discrimination are not subject to public inspection under the Maryland Public Information Act.

- 19 (a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, [the] A Commission shall file with the 20 [County Commissioners of St. Mary's County] COUNTY COMMISSIONERS a 21 comprehensive report of its activities at least once every 12 months.
- 22 (b) [The] A Commission may not reveal any confidential information in the report 23 to the county commissioners.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2021.
