A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Alcohol and Tobacco Commission – Executive Director – Clarification

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Executive Director of the Alcohol and Tobacco 4 Commission to be a sworn police officer with certain powers; specifying that the 5 Executive Director is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as 6 a condition of employment; requiring the Board of Trustees for the State Retirement 7 and Pension System to transfer certain service earned under certain circumstances; 8 requiring the Board of Trustees to transfer certain employer and member 9 contributions from the Employees' Pension System to the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; and generally relating to the Executive Director of the Alcohol and 10 11 Tobacco Commission.

10	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 2. the unlawful manufacture of alcoholic beverages and 2 tobacco in the State: 3 3. the transportation and distribution throughout the State 4 of alcoholic beverages and tobacco that are manufactured illegally and on which any 5 alcoholic beverages taxes or tobacco taxes imposed by the State are due and unpaid; and 6 4. the manufacture. sale. barter. transportation, 7 distribution, or other form of owning, handling, or dispersing alcoholic beverages or tobacco 8 by any person not licensed or authorized under this article, provisions of the Tax – General 9 Article relating to alcoholic beverages or tobacco, or provisions of the Business Regulation 10 Article relating to tobacco; and 11 may make cooperative arrangements for and work and cooperate (iii) 12 with the Office of the Comptroller, local State's Attorneys, sheriffs, bailiffs, police, and other 13 prosecuting and peace officers to enforce this article. 14 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 15 26-101.16 This title applies to the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System. 26-201. 17 18 Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies only (a) 19 to: 20 (20)a police officer employed by the Baltimore City Community College who 21has the power granted to a police officer under § 16–513 of the Education Article; [or] 22 an employee of the Warrant Apprehension Unit of the Division of Parole 23 and Probation in the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services who has the 24powers granted to a peace officer or police officer under § 6–106 of the Correctional Services 25Article: OR 26 THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO 27 COMMISSION. 28 26-202.

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- 29 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an individual described in \$ 26–201 of this subtitle is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as a condition of employment.
 - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

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- 1 (a) This section applies to an individual who:
- 2 (1) on May 31, 2021, is serving in the position of Executive Director of the 3 Alcohol and Tobacco Commission and remains in that position on June 1, 2021; and
- 4 (2) before December 1, 2020, was a member of the Law Enforcement 5 Officers' Pension System.
- 6 (b) The Board of Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System shall 7 transfer any service earned by an individual described under subsection (a) of this section 8 in the Employees' Pension System from December 1, 2020, through May 31, 2021, to the 9 Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.
- 10 (c) For service credit transferred under subsection (b) of this section, the Board 11 of Trustees shall transfer:
- 12 (1) to the accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 13 System the employer contributions that were made to the Employees' Pension System, plus 14 the interest earned on those contributions; and
- 15 (2) the member contributions from the annuity savings fund of the 16 Employees' Pension System to the annuity savings fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' 17 Pension System.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2021.
