Workgroup to Study Partial Expungement

- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- 13 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study Partial Expungement.
- 14 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 15 (1) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of 16 the Senate:
- 17 (2) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 18 the House:
- 19 (3) the Public Defender, or the Public Defender's designee;
- 20 (4) one representative of the Administrative Office of the Courts, appointed 21 by the Governor;
- 22 (5) the President of the Maryland State's Attorneys' Association, or the 23 President's designee; and

- 1 (6) one representative of the Job Opportunities Task Force, appointed by 2 the Governor.
- 3 (c) The Workgroup shall elect a chair from among its members.
- 4 (d) The Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services shall provide staff for the Workgroup.
- 6 (e) A member of the Workgroup:
- 7 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but
- 8 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 9 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 10 (f) The Workgroup shall study and develop a plan and legislative 11 recommendations for enabling the expungement of criminal charges that are currently not 12 eligible for expungement because of the requirements of § 10–107 of the Criminal Procedure 13 Article.
- 14 (g) On or before January 5, 2022, the Workgroup shall report its plan and legislative recommendations to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article.
  - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 6 months from the date it is enacted and, at the end of the 1—year and 6—month period, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
