# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

# Budget Bill - Appropriations Statement - Memorandum of Understanding for State Personnel

FOR the purpose of proposing an amendment to the Maryland Constitution to require the
Governor to include with the budget bill a statement showing the appropriations
necessary to implement and fund for the next ensuing fiscal year each memorandum
of understanding that incorporates wages and terms and conditions of employment
for certain State personnel; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters
of the State for their adoption or rejection.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be

15 proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

# Article III – Legislative Department

17 52.

18 (1) The General Assembly shall not appropriate any money out of the Treasury 19 except in accordance with the provisions of this section.

20 (2) Every appropriation bill shall be either a Budget Bill, or a Supplementary 21 Appropriation Bill, as hereinafter provided.

(3) On the third Wednesday in January in each year, (except in the case of a newly
elected Governor, and then not later than ten days after the convening of the General
Assembly), unless such time shall be extended by the General Assembly, the Governor shall

1 submit to the General Assembly a Budget for the next ensuing fiscal year. Each Budget  $\mathbf{2}$ shall contain a complete plan of proposed expenditures and estimated revenues for said 3 fiscal year and shall show the estimated surplus or deficit of revenues at the end of the 4 preceding fiscal year. Accompanying each Budget shall be a statement showing: (a) the  $\mathbf{5}$ revenues and expenditures for the preceding fiscal year; (b) the current assets, liabilities, 6 reserves and surplus or deficit of the State; (c) the debts and funds of the State; (d) an  $\mathbf{7}$ estimate of the State's financial condition as of the beginning and end of the preceding fiscal 8 year; (E) THE APPROPRIATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT AND FUND EACH MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR THE NEXT ENSUING FISCAL YEAR, 9 10 WHETHER REACHED THROUGH NEGOTIATIONS OR BINDING ARBITRATION, THAT IS BINDING ON THE STATE AND INCORPORATES WAGES AND TERMS AND CONDITIONS 11 OF EMPLOYMENT FOR EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, HIGHER EDUCATION, AND OTHER 12**STATE PERSONNEL; AND** [(e)] (F) any explanation the Governor may desire to make as 1314to the important features of the Budget and any suggestions as to methods for reduction or 15increase of the State's revenue.

16 (4)Each Budget shall embrace an estimate of all appropriations in such form and 17detail as the Governor shall determine or as may be prescribed by law, as follows: (a) for 18the General Assembly as certified to the Governor in the manner hereinafter provided; (b) 19for the Executive Department; (c) for the Judiciary Department, as provided by law, as 20certified to the Governor; (d) to pay and discharge the principal and interest of the debt of 21the State in conformity with Section 34 of Article III of the Constitution, and all laws 22enacted in pursuance thereof; (e) for the salaries payable by the State and under the 23Constitution and laws of the State; (f) for the establishment and maintenance throughout 24the State of a thorough and efficient system of public schools in conformity with Article 8 25of the Constitution and with the laws of the State; and (g) for such other purposes as are 26set forth in the Constitution or laws of the State.

27(5)The Governor shall deliver to the presiding officer of each House the Budget 28and a bill for all the proposed appropriations of the Budget classified and in such form and 29detail as he shall determine or as may be prescribed by law; and the presiding officer of 30 each House shall promptly cause said bill to be introduced therein, and such bill shall be 31 known as the "Budget Bill." The Governor may, with the consent of the General Assembly, 32before final action thereon by the General Assembly, amend or supplement said Budget to 33 correct an oversight, provide funds contingent on passage of pending legislation or, in case 34of an emergency, by delivering such an amendment or supplement to the presiding officers 35 of both Houses; and such amendment or supplement shall thereby become a part of said 36 Budget Bill as an addition to the items of said bill or as a modification of or a substitute for 37 any item of said bill such amendment or supplement may affect.

38 (5a) The Budget and the Budget Bill as submitted by the Governor to the General 39 Assembly shall have a figure for the total of all proposed appropriations and a figure for 40 the total of all estimated revenues available to pay the appropriations, and the figure for 41 total proposed appropriations shall not exceed the figure for total estimated revenues. 42 Neither the Governor in submitting an amendment or supplement to the Budget Bill nor 43 the General Assembly in amending the Budget Bill shall thereby cause the figure for total

proposed appropriations to exceed the figure for total estimated revenues, including any revisions, and in the Budget Bill as enacted the figure for total estimated revenues always shall be equal to or exceed the figure for total appropriations.

4 (6) The General Assembly shall not amend the Budget Bill so as to affect either 5 the obligations of the State under Section 34 of Article III of the Constitution, or the 6 provisions made by the laws of the State for the establishment and maintenance of a system 7 of public schools or the payment of any salaries required to be paid by the State of Maryland 8 by the Constitution.

9 In enacting a balanced Budget Bill each fiscal year as required under this (6a)10 Section, the General Assembly may amend the bill by increasing or diminishing the items 11 therein relating to the General Assembly, and by increasing or diminishing the items 12therein relating to the judiciary, but except as hereinbefore specified, may not alter the bill 13except to strike out or reduce items therein, provided, however, that the salary or 14compensation of any public officer may not be decreased during the public officer's term of 15office. When passed by both Houses, the Budget Bill shall be presented to the Governor for 16 approval or disapproval according to Section 17 of Article II of this Constitution.

17In enacting a balanced Budget Bill as required under this Section for fiscal (6b) 18 year 2024 and each fiscal year thereafter, the General Assembly may amend the bill by 19increasing, diminishing, or adding items therein relating to the General Assembly, by 20increasing, diminishing, or adding items therein relating to the judiciary, and by 21increasing, diminishing, or adding items relating to the Executive Department, provided 22that the total of the appropriation for the Executive Department approved by the General 23Assembly does not exceed the total proposed appropriation for the Executive Department 24submitted by the Governor. The salary or compensation of any public officer may not be 25decreased during the public officer's term of office. When passed by both Houses, the Budget 26Bill shall be a law immediately without further action by the Governor.

(7) The Governor and such representatives of the executive departments, boards, officers and commissions of the State expending or applying for State's moneys, as have been designated by the Governor for this purpose, shall have the right, and when requested by either House of the General Assembly, it shall be their duty to appear and be heard with respect to any Budget Bill during the consideration thereof, and to answer inquiries relative thereto.

33 Supplementary Appropriation Bill. Either House may consider other (8)34appropriations but both Houses shall not finally act upon such appropriations until after 35 the Budget Bill has been finally acted upon by both Houses, and no such other 36 appropriation shall be valid except in accordance with the provisions following: (a) Every 37such appropriation shall be embodied in a separate bill limited to some single work, object 38 or purpose therein stated and called herein a Supplementary Appropriation Bill; (b) Each 39 Supplementary Appropriation Bill shall provide the revenue necessary to pay the 40 appropriation thereby made by a tax, direct or indirect, to be levied and collected as shall 41 be directed in said bill; (c) No Supplementary Appropriation Bill shall become a law unless 42it be passed in each House by a vote of a majority of the whole number of the members

elected, and the yeas and nays recorded on its final passage; (d) Each Supplementary
Appropriation Bill shall be presented to the Governor of the State as provided in Section
17 of Article 2 of the Constitution and thereafter all the provisions of said section shall
apply.

5 (9) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the General Assembly 6 from passing at any time, in accordance with the provisions of Section 28 of Article 3 of the 7 Constitution and subject to the Governor's power of approval as provided in Section 17 of 8 Article 2 of the Constitution, an appropriation bill to provide for the payment of any 9 obligation of the State within the protection of Section 10 of Article 1 of the Constitution of 10 the United States.

11 (10) If the Budget Bill shall not have been finally acted upon by the Legislature 12 seven days before the expiration of the regular session, the Governor shall issue a 13 proclamation extending the session for some further period as may, in his judgment, be 14 necessary for the passage of such bill; but no matter other than such bill shall be considered 15 during such extended session except a provision for the cost thereof.

16 For the purpose of making up the Budget, the Governor shall require from the (11)17proper State officials (including all executive departments, all executive and administrative 18 offices, bureaus, boards, commissions and agencies that expend or supervise the 19expenditure of, and all institutions applying, for State moneys and appropriations) such 20itemized estimates and other information, in such form and at such times as directed by 21the Governor. An estimate for a program required to be funded by a law which will be in 22effect during the fiscal year covered by the Budget and which was enacted before July 1 of 23the fiscal year prior to that date shall provide a level of funding not less than that prescribed 24in the law. The estimates for the Legislative Department, certified by the presiding officer 25of each House, of the Judiciary, as provided by law, certified by the Chief Judge of the Court 26of Appeals, and for the public schools, as provided by law, shall be transmitted to the 27Governor, in such form and at such times as directed by the Governor, and shall be included 28in the Budget without revision.

29The Governor may provide for public hearings on all estimates and may (12)30 require the attendance at such hearings of representatives of all agencies, and for all institutions applying for State moneys. After such public hearings he may, in his discretion, 3132revise all estimates except those for the legislative and judiciary departments, and for the 33 public schools, as provided by law, and except that he may not reduce an estimate for a program below a level of funding prescribed by a law which will be in effect during the fiscal 3435year covered by the Budget, and which was enacted before July 1 of the fiscal year prior 36 thereto.

37 (13) The General Assembly may, from time to time, enact such laws not 38 inconsistent with this section, as may be necessary and proper to carry out its provisions.

39 (14) In the event of any inconsistency between any of the provisions of this Section 40 and any of the other provisions of the Constitution, the provisions of this Section shall 41 prevail. But nothing herein shall in any manner affect the provisions of Section 34 of Article

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3 of the Constitution or of any laws heretofore or hereafter passed in pursuance thereof, or be construed as preventing the Governor from calling extraordinary sessions of the General Assembly, as provided by Section 16 of Article 2, or as preventing the General Assembly at such ertraordinary [extraordinary] sessions from considering any emergency appropriation or appropriations.

6 (15) If any item of any appropriation bill passed under the provisions of this 7 Section shall be held invalid upon any ground, such invalidity shall not affect the legality 8 of the bill or of any other item of such bill or bills.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 10 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by Section 1 of this 11 Act affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland 12 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the amendment to the 13 14Maryland Constitution proposed by Section 1 of this Act shall be submitted to the qualified 15voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2022 for adoption or 16 rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that general election, the vote on the proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by ballot, and on each 17ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional Amendment" and "Against 18 19the Constitutional Amendment", as now provided by law. Immediately after the election, 20all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed 21amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further 22proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.
