3 **Foreign Student Exemption**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the application of certain provisions of law prohibiting an
5 institution of higher education from paying certain financial or other incentives
6 based on certain success to exempt the recruitment of certain foreign students; and
7 generally relating to the prohibition against incentive payments paid by institutions
8 of higher education.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Education**

17 11–402.1.

1 **(1) RESIDING IN A FOREIGN COUNTRY; AND**

2 **(2) NOT ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE FEDERAL STUDENT ASSISTANCE.**

3 **(B)** An institution of higher education may not pay a commission, a bonus, or any
4 other incentive payment based on success in securing enrollments or the award of financial
5 aid to a person or entity engaged in student recruitment or admission activity.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~July~~
7 June 1, 2021.
