The condition of our "lower stage" will also be addressed as it is in immediate need of repair before it can be used. This stage is used at events throughout the year and the decking, railing, electrical, and roof supports are in need of repair or replacement. This project will benefit all fair and event visitors of over 120,000 people annually. Public safety, security and access by individuals with disabilities will be enhanced with these initiatives.
