We have provided support for special needs citizens, homeless veterans through a national partnership with Dept of Housing and Urban Development, a drug awareness program, an Americanism program to foster patriotism in schools, support for the Sexual Assault Crisis Center, support for the Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, sponsorship of underprivileged youth to attend summer camp at ELKS Camp Barrett, collection of food in partnership with local LIONS Clubs for donation to local food banks

To address costly/unplanned requirements due to changes in county fire/health department regulations. These requirements include modernization of our fire alarm monitoring system, upgrade/replacement of interior doors, plumbing modifications and modernization of roofing. These have been mandated as mandatory requirements that we must adhere to. Our ability under normal circumstances to be able to meet these requirements is challenging. The challenge of migrating through COVID-19/ being closed for an extended period/having to operate at reduced levels makes obtaining outside assistance like this even more critical to sustaining our mission. Our organization has been in existence for 55 years providing charitable service (in partnership with Prince Georges County government and schools) to the citizens of Prince Georges County. We anticipate emerging from the pandemic and returning to providing the same type of charitable support for many years to come.
