10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)						

Central Baltimore Partnership (CBP) is a non-profit, charitable organization that works to galvanize the revitalization of 11 neighborhoods in Central Baltimore. CBP's more than 120 active partners work to achieve a comprehensive agenda. CBP leads planning, mobilizes partners, raises funds, and coordinates collaborative work toward shared goals that include re-use of long-vacant properties; improvements to public spaces including parks and playgrounds; development of a thriving arts district and reinvigorated commercial districts; expansion of education, job, housing, and recreation opportunity. CBP partners range from Johns Hopkins University, the Maryland Institute College of Art, and the University of Baltimore to neighborhood associations and small businesses, from Medstar Union Memorial Hospital to small nonprofits, artists, and arts organizations.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Central Baltimore Partnership's Partners for Safe and Healthy Homes initiative will support the cost of capital improvements to the homes of low-income homeowners in Central Baltimore. Funds will make possible critical repairs or replacements to roofs, furnaces, hot water heaters, plumbing; exterior improvements including windows, porches, stairs, and masonry; and handicap accessibility improvements such as chair lifts and grab bars. The average cost of repairs will be \$8,000. These funds will be used to jump-start a campaign to raise \$5 million over 5 years to improve 250 homes. This initiative is a partnership with St. Ambrose Housing Aid Center, Jubilee Baltimore, neighborhood associations, and independent contractors.
