The Center will consist of various components including a child care center for children up to pre-school, a senior center community space including a large atrium area, small child playground, a large caf for senior lunches and community members, various meeting rooms and a small retail area. A Senior Health and wellness center will be the final phase of the center.

28. Comments

Dorchester County, Maryland is a historically economically distressed area on Maryland's Eastern Shore, with a growing number of vulnerable individuals not helped by the decline in industry and employment opportunities over the last 50-30 years. Due to the pandemic this has accelerated. An emerging trend over the past 10-15 years includes the growing number of seniors aging in place or retiring in the area, some of whom require a higher level of support. This project will fill a much-needed gap in facility/services for the current population and also for future residents. With the addition of child care day services, complimentary programming will be developed to help provide mutually beneficial personal interactions that stimulates mental and physical health and well-being. This model is based on an established and proven intergenerational example including the St. Ann's Intergenerational Center in Milwaukee, WI. This has been repeated in several other cities throughout the country. This project will be one of the few in our Mid-Atlantic area and a significant addition to the eastern shore. The Intergenerational Center is envisioned to be a community center also open to the broader community for family activities. Skilled employment positions will be added such as nursing, physical rehabilitative, therapeutic opportunities, health/wellness, childcare and disability services positions. Other opportunities will be created for workforce training in cooperation with area schools and community programs.
