## **10. Description and Purpose of Organization** (Limit length to visible area)

The Elkton Colored School Museum and Cultural Center, Inc. is a non-profit organization based in the Town of Elkton. The purpose of the non-profit organization is to preserve and interpretive the legacy of the Elkton Colored School. During the period between 1864 and 1867, a subscription school was established in Elkton, Cecil Countys seat of government, devoted to the education of the African American children. Classes were held in the Providence A.M.E Church, where the seeds for the Elkton Colored School were initially planted. The Elkton Colored School was the first school for African Americans in the Cecil The Elkton Colored School will be a catalytic center for interpreting Black heritage, stimulating affordable housing, spurring minority businesses, enhancing Financial Literacy and providing space for the community.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of this project is to restore the Elkton Colored School located in the Elkton National Register Historic District. This project seeks to re-establish this historical and culturally significant community landmark by 2022 and in doing so the legacy of African American education will be re-honored. This project has engaged a development team which has created visionary restoration concept that seeks to adaptively reuse and restore the Elkton Colored School (originally built in the late 1800s, improved in 1926 by the Rosenwald fund and expanded in 1960s when it became Cecil County Operations & Maintenance Building). The project will fully utilizes the nearly 15,000 gross square feet of developable space. Programmed spaces include archival, research, exhibit, office, classroom and community spaces. Additionally, the development concept includes improvements to the 2-acre site including landscape, signage, lighting and on-site parking spaces.
