## 28. Comments

The Patapsco Valley Trail Center is a cooperative project between Maryland Park Service (MPS) and the Friends of Patapsco Valley State Park (a 501(c) 3 nonprofit), but it required the financial support of the community to make it a reality, The estimated total cost of this two-phase project is \$325,000. We have secured initial interest from previous and prospective donors to assist in direct underwriting and in-kind support of the project, and the Maryland Park Service has committed to assisting in the general maintenance of the house, site, driveways, and access to the property The Friends group must raise these funds through grassroots fundraising and corporate giving.

This will be an investment in a facility that will be used for planning, training, meetings, stewardship demonstrations, and the housing of a trail builder and naturalist in residence. The Maryland Park Service has approached the Friends of Patapsco Valley State Park in taking cooperative management and responsibility of what is called the White House, a 4 bedroom house in the Glen Artney area of PVSP. The house is unique as it sits wholly in the park and is owned by the Maryland Park Service. The property has large open spaces on the first floor that can easily be repurposed into meeting and multipurpose spaces. The house also sits on a large lot with immediate access to the Avalon and Glen Artney areas of the park and the extensive trail system at PVSP.
