The YMCA of the Chesapeake, Inc. (Y) respectfully requests a legislative bond bill to support the capital construction costs of the new, full-facility Kent County Family YMCA in Chestertown, Maryland. The Y is constructing a new 58,000 square foot facility to serve approximately 5,000 community members each year. A new facility will allow us to exponentially expand programs and services in the community through a new indoor pool, indoor track and gymnasium, multi-purpose rooms, Wellness Center, Stay & Play, and lounge/social gathering spaces. Communities need a place where everyone is welcome and can come together as one, regardless of background or financial limitation. This is where the Y can come in - bridging the socioeconomic divide to create a safe place and second home for the wonderful residents of Kent County. Building a full-facility YMCA will allow us to meet community needs in a way that we cannot accomplish in our existing facility.

Background: Kent County Family YMCA

The Ys involvement in Kent County began in 2016 when we opened a summer day camp site at the Kent School in Chestertown, Maryland. In January 2020 the Y assumed operation of the Kent Athletic Center to strengthen its service in the community. Since assuming responsibility of the facility, membership has grown from 300 members on December 31, 2019 to over 1,000 members today. We have worked with staff to expand programs and services at this location to better serve the residents of Kent County. Before our mandated COVID shutdown, we were successfully running Rock Steady Boxing, a program that helps slow the progression of Parkinsons disease, andwe were just about to launch a LiveSTRONG at the YMCA class, a 12-week cancer support program for those living through or beyond a cancer diagnosis.

Communities need a place where everyone is welcome and can come together as one, regardless of background or financial limitation. Everyone deserves access to robust community programs and services that help each person learn, grow, and thrive. This is where the Y can come in - bridging the socioeconomic divide to create a safe place and second home for the wonderful residents of Kent County.

Concept: Full-Facility YMCA in Kent County, Maryland

A full-facility YMCA will allow us to exponentially expand our programming and services in the community. The new facility will be 58,000 square feet and serve approximately 4,000-5,000 community members on a regular basis.

The new facility is currently slated to include:

- A.) A new indoor pool to provide a variety of program opportunities: swim lessons, learn to swim outreach programming in partnership with Kent County Public Schools, boater safety programming, low impact water exercise classes for adults and seniors, and YMCA, high school, masters swim team programming
- B.) An indoor track and gymnasium to serve as a hub for youth programs: summer camp, youth sports, after school programming, and community events
- C.) Multi-purpose rooms to support activities such as: group exercise classes, arts and humanities programs for youth and adults dance, art, ballet, tap, after school tutoring, community meeting space, and early learning programs
- D.) Wellness Center to encourage healthy habits
- E.) Stay & Play space to serve our youngest members and support our families.
- F.) Social gathering areas to create a place where everyone feels welcomed and comes together as a community.

We officially broke ground in September and hope to open the facility by December 2021.
