Since its founding in 1977, NCIA, a 501(c)(3) corporation, has been working on behalf of intellectually disabled adults, youth and other disadvantaged populations in Maryland. NCIA has over 600 employees and its headquarters has been in the Woodlawn area of Baltimore County since the late 1980s. One of our major programs is our Youth In Transition (YIT) School. For over 20 years, NCIA's YIT School has served the educational needs of children unable to participate in traditional school programs. We are licensed by the Maryland Department of Education. NCIA's adult program provides residential and vocational services to over 350 individuals with intellectual disabilities.

NCIA will be expanding its programs to serve both adults and youth. The NCIA facilities located at 7205 Rutherford Road include vocational training programs and will be purchased and renovated to allow for expansion and increase capacity.
