10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

PAL Baseball is a non-profit organization our mission is to organize and develop youth through baseball. Teams are comprised of players from the Greater Annapolis area. We provide our players with dedicated coaches who teach the physical aspects of baseball and a deeper understanding of how to play the game while maintaining high standards of excellence promoting sportsmanship, teamwork, and respect for the individual. We have teams for beginners of all age groups as well as travel teams for the advanced player who desires to play baseball at the highest level. The baseball year runs from March 1, until early November. On average, spring will see nearly 30 teams across seven age brackets, over 350 players, in the fall there will be about 10 teams across five age brackets. We also offer off-season workouts and. Summer Camps.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)
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The grant is for four distinct components. First, this plan includes improved drainage for all baseball fields, improved drainage will allow for greater use of the fields with minimized rain-out cancellations. Second, the purchase of new field grooming equipment will reduce the time it takes to prepare a field by approximately half. Currently, it takes almost 3-man hours to prepare a field for play. Third, the plan calls up to 6-batting cages or pitching tunnels between fields 1 and 2 to help the development of younger players. The final part of the plan is to provide storage near the lower fields to improve access to field maintenance equipment and training aids, allowing for maximum training time at the early development level.
