In 2020, Robertas House provided grief support services to over 6,000 children, adults, and families who have been devastated by traumatic losses. Providing support to homicide survivors is one of our largest programs serving over 650 victims annually. Our in-school programs are in 15 Baltimore City and 5 Prince Georges County schools reaching 8,000 children and teens. We provide a comprehensive array of 15 trauma-informed programs at our center that speak to the experiences of citizens who have experienced multiple losses (e.g., neglect, abandonment, poverty) and are in high-risk communities (e.g., those plagued by drugs, guns, and crime) with few resources.

In the 2008 Legislative Session, Roberta's House received \$300,000 Design and Acquisition

To date, we have raised \$13.9 million in contributions and pledges to our capital campaign. We

are very grateful for these contributions, including State bond bills to support architectural, demolition and construction. In order to complete the capital campaign including the construction of a green roof and parking lot we must secure \$1,442,220 million in 2020 to complete the project.
