10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

Torah Institute of Baltimore, a K-8 school, was established in 1952 starting with only 10 boys in a one-room school house. Unprecedented growth has pushed enrollment to 750 making Torah Institute one of the largest day schools in the country. The school has a history of delivering educational excellence, producing the next generation of highly motivated men prepared to fulfill their responsibilities in the communities in which they settle. What distinguishes our graduates is that they are not only provided with the tools to attain the highest level of Torah scholarship, they are also taught an abiding admiration for life, love of humanity, and to pursue justice and truth with all their hearts and souls. They are taught to strive to become better people and make the world a better place.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

In existing, but not utilized or finished spaces we plan to: Build a much needed, state of the art learning center to help children with learning disabilities. Build an occupational therapy center in order for children to receive OT services in school. (School does not charge rent to therapist - this is done solely as a benefit to the families whose children need OT and otherwise would likely not receive it outside of school hours) Build a 2,500 sf multi-purpose room. Build 4,500 sf in-door play-gym. These will be available for other community organizations and schools to use when our school is not in session. Repave entire parking lot. 20 years of wear and tear, and increased traffic due to increased enrollment has made this a critical necessity. See below for details.

Details about our plans:

Build a brand new state-of-the-art Learning Center to service children with learning disabilities. The new learning center will have multiple large and small tutoring rooms and a classroom, and will be utilized daily for one-on-one and small group instruction, educational assessments, and teacher and parent consultations.

Build a welcoming Occupational Therapy Center where each child will receive the services he needs in order to reach his developmental goals. On-site OT is convenient for parents (who otherwise would typically procrastinate servicing their children off-site until the issues progress and become severe) and enables early identification and intervention of a child's OT needs.

*The OT Center is a beneficial service as the school does not charge rent or receive a "kick-back" from the independent therapists. This is also serves as a source of livelihood for these therapists.

*The following will be available for use by other schools/organizations in the community:

Build a spacious Multi-Purpose Room with media center which will be used daily for recess, assemblies, presentations, special activities, and more!

Build an exciting Indoor Play Gym that offers a diverse recess experience, especially for children who enjoy imaginative play and climbing activities in lieu of sports.
