House Bill 9 Judiciary (Delegate Shetty)

Judicial Proceedings

Family Law - Mandatory Reporter Training

This bill requires the Department of Human Services (DHS) to post on its website a free online course on the identification, prevention, and reporting of child abuse.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Any minimal costs to DHS associated with the bill's requirement can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Child abuse is the physical or mental injury of a child younger than age 18 that indicates the child's health or welfare is harmed or at substantial risk of being harmed by a (1) parent; (2) family or household member; (3) person who has permanent or temporary custody of the child; (4) person who has responsibility for supervision of the child; or (5) exercises authority over the child because of their position or occupation. Child abuse is also any sexual injury of a child, whether physical injuries are sustained or not.

Mandatory reporters of child abuse include health care practitioners, police officers, educators, and human service workers who are acting in a professional capacity and who have reason to believe that a child has been subjected to abuse or neglect. Mandatory reporters must notify the local department of social services or the appropriate law enforcement agency. In general, a person other than a mandatory reporter who has

reason to believe that a child has been subjected to abuse or neglect must notify the local department of social services or the appropriate law enforcement agency.
