## 2 Environment – <del>Coal Tar</del> Sealant Products – Prohibitions 3 (Safer Sealant Act of 2022)

FOR the purpose of prohibiting, on or after a certain date, a person from supplying, selling, or offering for sale a high-PAH <del>coal tar</del> sealant product for application to a driveway or parking area in the State; prohibiting, on or after a certain date, a person from applying or soliciting the application of a high-PAH <del>coal tar</del> sealant product to a driveway or parking area in the State; prohibiting, on or after a certain date, a person from supplying, selling, offering for sale, or manufacturing a coal tar sealant product for application to a driveway or parking area in the State unless the sealant product is labeled in accordance with standards adopted by the Department of the Environment; prohibiting a county, municipality, or unit of local government from adopting any ordinance, rule, or regulation related to coal tar sealant products that are less stringent than the requirements of this Act; applying certain provisions of law to enforce violations of this Act and making a violation of this Act a civil offense; requiring certain penalties to be paid into the Maryland Clean Water Fund; providing that a person who violates this Act is subject to a certain administrative penalty; altering the use of the Fund to include activities that are conducted by the Department under this Act; and generally relating to <del>coal tar</del> sealant products.
