24 25	(1) the status of the upgrade of the Comptroller's online payment processing portal;
26 27	(2) the status of plans to upgrade the State's Financial Management Information System, including target dates for critical project milestones;
28 29	(3) the status of plans to ensure all units of government engaging in procurement utilize electronic systems for the processing of payments; and
30 31	(4) the extent to which all electronic payment processing systems used by units of State government can be integrated into one central electronic system.

4 5 6	(c) It is the intent of the General Assembly that any plans for the upgrade of the State's Financial Management Information System include goals to significantly reduce the amount of time in which payments are processed.
