13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17	(a)	Each member of the Appeals Board shall devote full time to the duties of office.
18	(b)	Each member of the Appeals Board is entitled to:
19		(1) compensation in accordance with the State budget; and
20 21	Regulations,	(2) reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel as provided in the State budget.



- 1 (c) (1) [The] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, 2 THE Appeals Board may employ a staff in accordance with the State budget.
- 3 (2) THE APPEALS BOARD SHALL HAVE AT LEAST THREE MORE 4 POSITIONS THAN THE NUMBER OF POSITIONS AUTHORIZED IN FISCAL YEAR 2022.
- 5 (3) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE 6 APPEALS BOARD SHALL EMPLOY AT LEAST THREE LAW CLERKS.
- 7 (II) THE APPEALS BOARD SHALL EMPLOY:
- 8 1. AT LEAST ONE LAW CLERK WHO IS A GRADUATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND SCHOOL OF LAW;
- 2. AT LEAST ONE LAW CLERK WHO IS A GRADUATE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF BALTIMORE SCHOOL OF LAW; AND
- 3. AT LEAST ONE LAW CLERK WHO IS A GRADUATE OF HOWARD UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF LAW.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2022.
