Public Schools - Cyber Safety Guide and Training Course - Development, Implementation, and Reporting

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education, the Behavioral Health 5 Administration within the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Center 6 for School Safety, and the Department of Information Technology jointly to develop 7 and publish a cyber safety guide and training course to be implemented in public 8 schools beginning in a certain school year; requiring the cyber safety guide and 9 training course to be developed in consultation with certain professionals; requiring 10 the cyber safety guide to be posted on the websites of the State Department of 11 Education and the Maryland Center for School Safety and distributed to each county 12 board of education; authorizing a county board to offer credit on completion of the 13 training course; and generally relating to the development and implementation of a cyber safety guide and training course in public schools. 14

- 24 (A) (1) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2023, THE DEPARTMENT, THE

- BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION WITHIN THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF 1 HEALTH, THE MARYLAND CENTER FOR SCHOOL SAFETY, AND THE DEPARTMENT 3 OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY JOINTLY SHALL DEVELOP AND PUBLISH A CYBER 4 SAFETY GUIDE AND TRAINING COURSE TO BE IMPLEMENTED IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS BEGINNING IN THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR. 5 6 THE CYBER SAFETY GUIDE AND TRAINING COURSE SHALL 7 CONTAIN INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE ON SAFE INTERNET, SOCIAL MEDIA, AND 8 TECHNOLOGY USAGE FOR: 9 (I)STUDENTS IN GRADES 3 THROUGH 12; 10 (II)PARENTS; AND 11 (III) SCHOOL EMPLOYEES WHO INTERACT WITH STUDENTS. 12 (B) THE CYBER SAFETY GUIDE AND TRAINING COURSE UNDER THIS 13 SECTION SHALL: 14 **(1)** BE DEVELOPED IN CONSULTATION WITH PROFESSIONALS WHO 15 SPECIALIZE IN CHILD DEVELOPMENT AND CHILD PSYCHOLOGY; AND 16 INCLUDE INFORMATION AND BEST PRACTICES THAT PROMOTE RESPONSIBLE INTERNET USE THROUGH PREVENTION AND MANAGEMENT OF: 17 18 (I)CYBERBULLYING; 19 (II) CONTENT DEPICTING OR ENCOURAGING SUICIDE OR 20SELF-HARM; 21 (III) HATE SPEECH; 22 (IV) SEXUALLY GRAPHIC CONTENT; 23 (V) SALES OF ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES; 24(VI) IDENTITY THEFT AND CYBERSECURITY THREATS; 25(VII) DISSEMINATION OF FALSE INFORMATION; AND
- 26 (VIII) NEGATIVE IMPACTS OF SOCIAL MEDIA AND TECHNOLOGY 27 USAGE ON BEHAVIORAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH.

- (C) THE CYBER SAFETY GUIDE SHALL BE: 1 2**(1)** POSTED ON THE WEBSITES OF THE DEPARTMENT AND THE 3 MARYLAND CENTER FOR SCHOOL SAFETY; AND **(2)** 4 DISTRIBUTED TO EACH COUNTY BOARD. 5 (D) THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE SHALL: 6 **(1)** BE UPDATED EACH YEAR AND AVAILABLE ON THE DEPARTMENT'S 7 WEBSITE; 8 **(2)** BE SELF-GUIDED; 9 **(3)** INCLUDE SEPARATE TRAINING COMPONENTS FOR STUDENTS, 10 PARENTS, AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES; 11 **(4)** OFFER A CERTIFICATE ON COURSE COMPLETION; AND 12 INCLUDE A PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMPONENT THAT 13 SATISFIES SCHOOL ACCREDITATION STANDARDS AND PERSONNEL CERTIFICATION 14 REQUIREMENTS. 15 THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE MAY INCORPORATE OTHER 16 STATE, FEDERAL, NONPROFIT, OR PUBLIC TRAINING MODULES. 17 A COUNTY BOARD MAY OFFER STUDENTS CREDIT FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE CYBER SAFETY TRAINING COURSE. 18 19 (G) EACH YEAR, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL: 20 **(1)** SEND A LIST OF AVAILABLE ONLINE TRAINING MODULES AND ANY 21UPDATES TO ONLINE TRAINING TO EACH COUNTY BOARD; AND 22**(2)** COMPILE DATA FROM EACH COUNTY BOARD ON THE NUMBER OF 23STAFF AND STUDENTS BY GRADE LEVEL WHO HAVE RECEIVED CERTIFICATION OR
- 25 (H) THE STATE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 26 SECTION.
