J1 2lr1863 **CF HB 578** By: Senator Augustine Introduced and read first time: January 20, 2022 Assigned to: Finance Committee Report: Favorable with amendments Senate action: Adopted Read second time: March 4, 2022 CHAPTER AN ACT concerning Maryland Medical Assistance Program - Prior Authorization for Drug Products Public Health - Medications to Treat an Opioid Use Disorder - Prohibition Preferred and Nonpreferred Medications FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Maryland Medical Assistance Program from applying a prior authorization requirement for certain drug products when used to treat an opioid use disorder; and generally relating to the Maryland Medical Assistance Program and the coverage of drug products requiring the Maryland Department of Health to adopt a certain reporting system, analyze patterns of prescribing medications in the State, conduct outreach, and identify certain barriers related to prescribing medications to treat an opioid use disorder; and generally relating to medications to treat an opioid use disorder. BY adding to Article – Health – General Section 15-150 8-1102 to be under the amended subtitle "Subtitle 11. Opioid Addiction Treatment Prescribers" Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
