CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Maryland Electricians Act – Revisions

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that the State Board of Electricians credit an applicant's work 4 as part of certain apprenticeships for the experience required for certain electrician 5 licenses; requiring the State Board to waive the examination requirements for 6 certain applicants for a journeyperson electrician license; adjusting the number of 7 years an applicant for journeyperson electrician must work under a certain 8 circumstance; authorizing a master electrician or a person to whom a master 9 electrician assigns a local registration to not maintain certain insurance under 10 certain circumstances requiring that applicants for certain local permits have a State 11 license to provide electrical services; providing for the delayed issuance of an 12 <u>electrical permit;</u> requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to examine certain 13 memoranda of understanding; requiring the Department to attempt to renegotiate 14 certain memoranda of understanding in certain circumstances; requiring the 15 Department to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on certain 16 memoranda of understanding; and generally relating to the licensure of electricians in the State. 17

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 5 (a) To qualify for a State license, an applicant shall meet the requirements of this section.
- 7 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, an applicant for a master 8 electrician license shall have been engaged or employed regularly and principally in 9 providing electrical services for all types of electrical equipment and apparatuses for at 10 least 7 years while under the direction and supervision of:
- 11 (i) a master electrician; or
- 12 (ii) a similarly qualified employee of a governmental unit.
- 13 (2) (I) The State Board may allow an applicant up to 3 years of credit 14 toward the experience required under paragraph (1) of this subsection, if the State Board 15 determines that the applicant has completed a formal course of study or professional 16 training in electrical installation comparable to the required experience.
- (II) THE STATE BOARD SHALL CREDIT TOWARD THE EXPERIENCE REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AN APPLICANT'S WORK AS PART OF A SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ELECTRICIAN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM APPROVED BY THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COUNCIL OR THE FEDERAL OFFICE OF APPRENTICESHIP.

21	to the local jurisdiction, the applicant may satisfy the bond requirement by submitting proof				
22	of the insurance required under this section.

24	(a) An electrician may obtain an electrical permit or any other similar permit				
25	from a local jurisdiction, if the electrician:				
26	(1) (I) HOLDS A STATE LICENSE; AND				
27	(II) is actively registered locally, if required[, or holds a State				
28	license];				
29	(2) shows proof of the State license; [and]				
30	(3) pays any permit fee that the local jurisdiction requires; AND				
31	(4) PROVIDES PROOF OF INSURANCE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE				
32	REQUIREMENTS OF § 6–604 OF THIS SUBTITLE.				

- 1 (b) Before a local jurisdiction issues an electrical permit or similar permit to an electrician under this section, the local jurisdiction shall give the electrician notice of any local electrical requirements with which the electrician shall comply while providing electrical services in that local jurisdiction.
- 5 (c) (1) [On] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
 6 SUBSECTION, ON payment of the permit fee that the local jurisdiction requires, the local
 7 jurisdiction shall issue the appropriate permit to each applicant who meets the
 8 requirements of this section.
- 9 (2) A LOCAL JURISDICTION MAY DELAY THE ISSUANCE OF AN
 10 ELECTRICAL PERMIT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IF, FOR A PARTICULAR JOB, THE
 11 LOCAL JURISDICTION REQUIRES THE ISSUANCE OF OTHER PERMITS, INCLUDING A
 12 BUILDING PERMIT, BEFORE ISSUANCE OF THE ELECTRICAL PERMIT.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

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- (a) The Maryland Department of Labor shall review each memorandum of understanding that the State has entered into with another state or territory guaranteeing a reciprocal recognition of electrician licenses to determine whether all licenses issued to master electricians under Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article is covered by the terms of the memorandum of understanding.
- 19 (b) If the Maryland Department of Labor determines that the terms of a 20 memorandum of understanding do not cover a master electrician who is licensed in 21 accordance with Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article, the 22 Department shall seek to renegotiate the terms of the memorandum of understanding to 23 include licenses for those master electricians who are not covered.
- 24 (c) On or before January 1, 2023, the Maryland Department of Labor shall report 25 to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the 26 General Assembly on:
- 27 (1) any outstanding memoranda of understanding with other states or 28 territories guaranteeing a reciprocal recognition of electrician licenses that:
- 29 (i) do not recognize master electricians authorized for licensure 30 under Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; and
- 31 (ii) that the Department was unable to renegotiate; and
- 32 (2) actions needed in order to guarantee that a license issued to a master 33 electrician in accordance with Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article 34 can be brought under the terms of a memorandum of understanding identified in item (1) 35 of this subsection, including:
