SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 1 2 October 1, 2022. June 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2023, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, 3 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
