 $\mathbf{5}$ (xvi) Beginning on January 1, 2021, shall provide, subject to the 6 limitations of the State budget and § 15–855(b)(2) of the Insurance Article, and as permitted 7 by federal law, services for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated 8 with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, including the use of intravenous immunoglobulin therapy, for eligible Program recipients, 9 10 if pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections 11 and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome are coded for billing and diagnosis 12purposes in accordance with § 15–855(d) of the Insurance Article; [and]

(xvii) Beginning on January 1, 2022, may not include, subject to federal
approval and limitations of the State budget, a frequency limitation on covered dental
prophylaxis care or oral health exams that requires the dental prophylaxis care or oral
health exams to be provided at an interval greater than 120 days within a plan year; AND

17 (XVIII) SHALL PROVIDE, SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF 18 THE STATE BUDGET, COMPREHENSIVE MEDICAL CARE AND OTHER HEALTH CARE 19 SERVICES TO NONCITIZEN PREGNANT WOMEN WHO WOULD BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE 20 PROGRAM BUT FOR THEIR IMMIGRATION STATUS AND TO THEIR CHILDREN UP TO 21 THE AGE OF 1 YEAR.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, in implementing the requirements of Section 1 of this Act, the Maryland Department of Health shall apply for the waiver from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that maximizes federal funding and the individuals who would be eligible for the Maryland Medical Assistance Program benefit required under Section 1 of this Act.

 1, 2022.
