Property Tax Exemption – Disabled Veteran, Active Duty, and Surviving Spouse Application Process

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The disabled veteran's certificate of disability may not be inspected by 1 (2) $\mathbf{2}$ individuals other than: 3 (i) the disabled veteran; or 4 (ii) appropriate employees of the State, a county, or a municipal $\mathbf{5}$ corporation. 6 A disabled active duty service member shall apply for an exemption (3)7 under this section by providing to the supervisor, on the form provided by the Department, a certification of the service member's disability from a physician licensed to practice 8 9 medicine in the State or from the Veterans' Administration. 10 (4)A surviving spouse of an individual who died in the line of duty shall apply for an exemption under this section by providing to the supervisor certification that 11 12the individual died while in active service as a result of an injury or disease incurred in the 13line of duty. 14(5) AN INDIVIDUAL MAY SUBMIT, AND THE DEPARTMENT **(I)** 15SHALL ACCEPT, AN APPLICATION FOR THE EXEMPTION UNDER THIS SECTION FOR A 16SPECIFIC DWELLING HOUSE THE INDIVIDUAL INTENDS TO PURCHASE BEFORE THE 17INDIVIDUAL PURCHASES A THE DWELLING HOUSE. 18 **(II)** THE DEPARTMENT, WITHIN 15 BUSINESS DAYS WITHIN 15 19BUSINESS DAYS FOLLOWING RECEIPT OF AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED UNDER 20SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, SHALL PROCESS THE APPLICATION AND 21NOTIFY THE APPLICANT OF THE APPROVAL OR DENIAL OF THE APPLICATION SEND 22THE APPLICANT A LETTER STATING: 23THAT THE APPLICATION IS PRELIMINARILY 1. 24APPROVED OR PRELIMINARILY DENIED; AND 252. IF THE APPLICATION IS PRELIMINARILY APPROVED, 26THE AMOUNT OF THE TAX EXEMPTION FOR THE DWELLING THE INDIVIDUAL 27**INTENDS TO PURCHASE.** 28(III) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS ISSUED A LETTER PRELIMINARILY 29APPROVING THE EXEMPTION SHALL RECEIVE THE EXEMPTION FOR THE DWELLING 30 REFERENCED IN THE LETTER AFTER BECOMING THE OWNER OF THE DWELLING 31 WITHOUT HAVING TO FILE ANOTHER APPLICATION. 32SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect 33 October 1, 2022.

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
