Westowne Elementary School, in District 4	4B (southwest B	altimore County), serves				

Westowne Elementary School, in District 44B (southwest Baltimore County), serves approximately 700 students from preschool through 5th grade and their families. Surrounding communities also use the grounds of Westowne Elementary for play space and recreation. Westowne's student body reflects the broad racial, ethnic, and economic diversity of its surrounding community. As of the 2020-21 school year, the student body is approximately 13% Asian, 37% Black, 7.6% Hispanic, 34% White, and 7.6% two or more races. Approximately 49% of the students at Westowne qualify for free and reduced price lunch.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Westowne does not currently have a playground that well serves the older children at the school and in the community, particularly those Grades 2 through 5. A longstanding and beloved playground at the school had most of its equipment removed in November of 2019 due to safety concerns, and was never replaced. Westowne's current playgrounds are small and do not well serve the needs of older students. Further, Westowne lacks other facilities that would serve older students, such as a hard court, that other area schools have. This project would allow for the building of an accessible playground within the line of sight of the school that would provide a much needed recreation space for Westowne students and the surrounding community.
