CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Horse Riding – Helmet Requirement for Minors**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an adult from allowing certain minors to ride a horse on
4 certain property unless the minor is wearing a helmet that meets certain standards;
5 and generally relating to helmet requirements and horse riding.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Transportation**

14 21–104.

15 (a) Every person riding an animal or driving an animal–drawn vehicle on a
16 roadway has all the rights granted to and is subject to all the duties required of the driver
17 of a vehicle by this title, except for those provisions of this title that by their very nature
18 cannot apply.

1 (b) (1) Except in Charles, Worcester, and St. Mary's counties, or as provided
2 in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person may not ride an animal or drive an
3 animal-drawn vehicle on:

4 (i) Any divided highway where the posted maximum speed limit is
5 more than 35 miles per hour; or

6 (ii) Any controlled access highway.

7 (2) In Anne Arundel County, a person may ride an animal on any part of a
8 highway described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, other than on its roadway or
9 shoulder.

10 (c) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "HORSE" INCLUDES DONKEYS, MULES, AND
11 PONIES.

12 (2) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH,
13 THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO HORSE RIDING ON:

14 1. A HIGHWAY;

15 2. A PUBLIC HORSE-RIDING PATH; OR

16 3. ~~ANY OTHER PROPERTY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC OR~~
17 ~~USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR PEDESTRIAN OR VEHICULAR TRAFFIC~~ THE GROUNDS OF
18 A FACILITY FOR WHICH THE PRIMARY PURPOSE IS RECREATIONAL, EDUCATIONAL,
19 OR COMPETITIVE EQUESTRIAN ACTIVITIES.

20 (II) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A MINOR WHO IS:

21 1. PRACTICING FOR OR COMPETING OR PERFORMING IN
22 A SHOW OR EVENT WHERE HELMETS ARE NOT HISTORICALLY PART OF THE SHOW OR
23 EVENT;

24 2. CROSSING A PUBLIC HIGHWAY THAT SEPARATES
25 PRIVATELY OWNED LAND;

26 3. ENGAGED IN AN AGRICULTURAL PRACTICE OR
27 PURSUIT; OR

28 4. A MEMBER OF AN AMISH OR A MENNONITE
29 COMMUNITY.

30 (3) AN ADULT WHO IS PRESENT AND DIRECTLY SUPERVISING A
31 MINOR MAY NOT ALLOW THE MINOR TO RIDE A HORSE UNLESS THE MINOR IS

1 WEARING A PROPERLY SECURED HELMET THAT MEETS OR EXCEEDS THE
2 STANDARDS OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF TESTING AND MATERIALS FOR
3 PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR USED IN EQUESTRIAN RIDING.

4 (4) A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION INVOLVING AN ADULT
5 SUPERVISING MULTIPLE MINORS AT THE SAME TIME SHALL BE TREATED AS A
6 SINGLE VIOLATION.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 October 1, 2023.
