Corporate Income Tax - Combined Reporting

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain corporations to compute Maryland taxable income 4 using a certain method; authorizing certain corporations, subject to regulations 5 adopted by the Comptroller, to determine certain income using a certain method; 6 requiring, subject to regulations adopted by the Comptroller, certain groups of 7 corporations to file a combined income tax return reflecting the aggregate income tax 8 liability of all the members of the group; requiring the Comptroller to adopt certain 9 regulations consistent with certain regulations adopted by the Multistate Tax 10 Commission; providing a subtraction modification under the Maryland corporate 11 income tax for certain changes to a certain combined group's deferred tax assets or 12 liabilities that are the result of certain provisions of this Act; prohibiting the subtraction from being reduced as a result of an event that occurs after the 13 14 calculation of the subtraction; providing, under certain circumstances, for the 15 carryforward of the subtraction; authorizing the Comptroller to review and alter the 16 amount of the subtraction specified in the statement or claimed on certain tax 17 returns; and generally relating to the Maryland income tax on corporations.



- 33 (C) THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT ARE

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2024, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2024.
