BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Election Law Section 10-206 and 10-306 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Election Law 10 - 206.(a) In consultation with the local boards, the State Board shall: (1) develop a program of instruction of election judges; and

oversee the implementation of the program of instruction.

- 1 (b) **(1)** The training materials [utilized] USED by the program may include: 2 [(1)](I)an instruction manual and other written directives; 3 curriculum for training sessions; and [(2)](II)4 [(3)](III) audiovisuals.
