1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning, and Refrigeration Services**
3 **– Journeyman License – Qualifications**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the qualifications for a journeyman license to provide heating,
5 ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration services; and generally relating to
6 journeyman licenses for heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration
7 services.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Business Regulation**

2 Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual shall be licensed by the
3 Board before the individual provides or assists in providing heating, ventilation,
4 air-conditioning, or refrigeration services in the State.

5 9A-302.

6 (a) To qualify for an apprentice, journeyman, journeyman restricted, master,
7 master restricted, or limited license, an applicant shall meet the requirements of this
8 section.

9 (e) An applicant for a journeyman license shall:

10 (1) have held, for a period of at least [3] 4 years, an apprentice license, and
11 during that period shall have completed at least [1,875] 6,000 hours of training in
12 providing heating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and refrigeration services under the
13 direction and control of a licensed contractor; and

14 (2) pass an examination administered by the Board.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16 October 1, 2023.
