
- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Education, as part of a certain plan, to 5 identify methods for finding and eliminating instances of corporal punishment 6 administered to discipline a student; prohibiting the State Board from issuing a 7 certificate of approval to certain noncollegiate educational institutions that do not 8 have a policy prohibiting certain personnel at the institution from administering 9 corporal punishment to discipline a student at the institution; requiring regulations 10 adopted by the State Board for the registration of family child care homes and large 11 family child care homes and the licensing and operation of child care centers to 12 prohibit the administration of corporal punishment to discipline a child; and 13 generally relating to the prohibition of corporal punishment in nonpublic schools and by child care providers. 14

- 24 (11) (i) A requirement that a family child care home or large family child 25 care home that receives notice of a contaminated drinking water supply from the family 26 child care home's or large family child care home's supplier of water, in accordance with § 27 9–410 of the Environment Article or otherwise, send notice of the drinking water 28 contamination to the parent or legal guardian of each child attending the family child care 29 home or large family child care home; and

- 1. Be sent within 10 business days after receipt of the notice of contamination from the family child care home's or large family child care home's water supplier;
