AN ACT concerning
Early Childhood Education – Prekindergarten Programs – Montessori Schools and Programs
FOR the purpose of altering the eligibility requirements for the Prekindergarten Expansion Grant Program and publicly funded prekindergarten programs to include certain operational requirements, staff credentials, and student—to—staff ratios for Montessori schools and programs; and generally relating to the inclusion of Montessori schools and programs in prekindergarten programs in the State.
BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Education Section 7–101.2(a)(1) , (5), and (6) and (b)(1) and 7–1A–01(a) and (c) through (e) Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume)


