(2) AN ELIGIBLE PREKINDERGARTEN PROVIDER THAT IS A MONTESSORI SCHOOL OR MONTESSORI PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE ALL OF THE STRUCTURAL ELEMENTS LISTED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION EXCEPT THE FOLLOWING:
(I) FOR STAFF QUALIFICATIONS, THE ELIGIBLE PREKINDERGARTEN PROVIDER SHALL EMPLOY TEACHERS WHO ARE CERTIFIED BY:
1. The Association Montessori Internationale, USA;
2. THE AMERICAN MONTESSORI SOCIETY; OR
3. THE MONTESSORI ACCREDITATION COUNCIL FOR TEACHER EDUCATION; AND
(II) FOR THE STUDENT-TO-CLASSROOM PERSONNEL RATIO, THE PREKINDERGARTEN PROVIDER SHALL MAINTAIN A STUDENT-TO-CLASSROOM PERSONNEL RATIO OF NO MORE THAN 10 TO 1 FOR STUDENTS UNDER THE AGE OF 5 YEARS AND NO MORE THAN 15 TO 1 FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE AT LEAST 5 YEARS OLD.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July

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1 1, 2023.
