## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Maryland Forestry Education Fund – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Forestry Education Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund to expand and enhance the Maryland Forestry Foundation's 4  $\mathbf{5}$ capacity to provide certain education and resources to forest landowners, the ability 6 of district forestry boards and the knowledge of local governments to achieve healthy 7 and sustainable forests, and the ability of businesses to test innovative best 8 management practices in forestry; requiring interest earnings of the Fund to be 9 credited to the Fund; and generally relating to the Maryland Forestry Education Fund. 10
