CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

Cigarette Restitution Fund – Payments for Sale and Marketing of Electronic Smoking Devices – Use

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Cigarette Restitution Fund to include a separate account consisting of payments received by the State as a result of litigation by participating 5 6 manufacturers from certain enforcement actions related to the sale and marketing 7 of electronic smoking devices; providing that distributions from the separate account 8 may be used only, consistent with any other State law, to supplement General Fund 9 appropriations designated for certain programs with the purpose of reducing the use 10 of tobacco products by individuals under a certain age; and generally relating to the 11 Cigarette Restitution Fund.

0	(a) There is a Cigarette Restitution Fund.
11	(b) (1) The Fund is a continuing, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to \S 7–302 of this subtitle.
13 14 15 16 17 18	(2) [Except as provided in subsection] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTIONS (h) AND (I) of this section, there shall be credited to the Fund all revenues consisting of funds received by the State from any source resulting, directly or indirectly, from any judgment against or settlement with tobacco product manufacturers, tobacco research associations, or any other person in the tobacco industry relating to litigation, administrative proceedings, or any other claims made or prosecuted by the State to recover damages for violations of State law.
20 21	(3) There shall be credited to the Fund all money collected under $\S~24-508$ of the Health – General Article or $\S~5-608$ of the Labor and Employment Article.
22	(f) (1) The Cigarette Restitution Fund shall be used to fund:

- 1 implementation of the Southern Maryland Regional 2 Strategy-Action Plan for Agriculture adopted by the Tri-County Council for Southern Maryland with an emphasis on alternative crop uses for agricultural land now used for 3 4 growing tobacco; 5 3. public and school education campaigns to decrease tobacco 6 use with initial emphasis on areas targeted by tobacco manufacturers in marketing and promoting cigarette and tobacco products; 7 8 4. smoking cessation programs; 9 5. enforcement of the laws regarding tobacco sales; 10 6. the purposes of the Maryland Health Care Foundation under Title 20, Subtitle 5 of the Health – General Article; 11 12 7. primary health care in rural areas of the State and areas 13 targeted by tobacco manufacturers in marketing and promoting cigarette and tobacco 14 products: 15 prevention, treatment, and research concerning cancer, 8. 16 heart disease, lung disease, tobacco product use, and tobacco control, including operating 17 costs and related capital projects; 9. substance abuse treatment and prevention programs; and 18 19 any other public purpose. 10. 20 The provisions of this subsection may not be construed to affect the 21Governor's powers with respect to a request for an appropriation in the annual budget bill. 22 **(I) (1)** THE FUND SHALL INCLUDE A SEPARATE ACCOUNT CONSISTING 23 OF PAYMENTS RECEIVED BY THE STATE AS A RESULT OF LITIGATION BY 24PARTICIPATING MANUFACTURERS FROM ANY JUDGMENT, SETTLEMENT, PENALTY, 25OFFER OF COMPROMISE, OR ANY OTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION RELATED TO THE 26 SALE AND MARKETING OF ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES. 27 **(2)** DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE SEPARATE ACCOUNT ESTABLISHED 28 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY BE USED ONLY, CONSISTENT WITH 29 ANY OTHER PROVISION OF STATE LAW, TO SUPPLEMENT THE GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS DESIGNATED FOR PROGRAMS UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS 30 SECTION WITH THE PURPOSE OF REDUCING THE USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS BY 31
- [(i)] (J) For each program, project, or activity receiving funds appropriated under subsection (g)(3) of this section, the Governor shall:
