- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Environment
- 15 **9–331.2**.

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- 16 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 17 INDICATED.
- 18 (2) "DRAFT METHOD 1633" MEANS THE DRAFT METHOD FOR THE
- 19 ANALYSIS OF PFAS IN AQUEOUS, SOLID, BIOSOLIDS, AND TISSUE SAMPLES BY
- 20 LIQUID CHROMATOGRAPHY/MASS SPECTROMETRY PUBLISHED BY THE U.S.
- 21 Environmental Protection Agency.
  - (3) "PFAS" MEANS PER- AND POLYFLUOROALKYL SUBSTANCES.

- 1 (B) THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A PUBLICLY OWNED TREATMENT WORKS 2 SHALL:
- 3 (1) AT LEAST QUARTERLY, MONITOR PFAS LEVELS IN EFFLUENT, 4 INFLUENT, AND BIOSOLIDS; AND
- 5 (2) IN ACCORDANCE WITH 40 C.F.R. § 122.41(L)(4), REPORT ALL 6 PFAS MONITORING DATA ON THE APPLICABLE DISCHARGE MONITORING REPORT.
- 7 (C) PFAS MONITORING UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL:
- 8 (1) BE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH:
- 9 (I) THE FINAL METHOD ADOPTED BY THE U.S. 10 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY UNDER 40 C.F.R. PART 136; OR
- 11 (II) IF A FINAL METHOD HAS NOT BEEN ADOPTED, DRAFT 12 METHOD 1633; AND
- 13 (2) At a minimum, include each of the 40 PFAS parameters 14 Detectable by draft method 1633.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
