2 Primary and Secondary Education - Policies on Bullying, Harassment, or 3 Intimidation - Revisions

- FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for a model policy prohibiting bullying, 4 5 harassment, or intimidation in public and nonpublic schools; prohibiting public and nonpublic school employees from being civilly liable for reporting or failing to report an act of bullying, harassment, or intimidation under certain circumstances; requiring the State Board of Education and each nonpublic school to update a certain policy on or before a certain date; and generally relating to public and nonpublic school policies on bullying, harassment, or intimidation.

- 7 (b) On or before September 1, 2023, each nonpublic school shall update its policy 8 prohibiting bullying, harassment, and intimidation in nonpublic schools required under § 9 7–424.3 of the Education Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
