21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- (A) (1) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME PREVENTION, YOUTH, AND 1 VICTIM SERVICES SHALL ESTABLISH AND ADMINISTER A REPORTING PROGRAM FOR 3 TRACKING THE LOCATION, STATUS, AND CHAIN OF CUSTODY FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT 4 EVIDENCE COLLECTION KITS. **(2)** 5 THE REPORTING PROGRAM SHALL: 6 **(I)** TRACK THE LOCATION, STATUS, AND CHAIN OF CUSTODY OF 7 SEXUAL ASSAULT EVIDENCE COLLECTION KITS IN THE STATE; 8 (II)RECEIVE INFORMATION RELATING TO THE LOCATION, 9 STATUS, AND CHAIN OF CUSTODY FROM ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY OR PERSON WITH CONTROL OR POSSESSION OF A SEXUAL ASSAULT EVIDENCE 10 11 **COLLECTION KIT; AND** 12 (III) ALLOW FOR A VICTIM OR A VICTIM'S REPRESENTATIVE TO TRACK THE LOCATION, STATUS, AND CHAIN OF CUSTODY OF A SEXUAL ASSAULT 13 EVIDENCE COLLECTION KIT CONTAINING SAMPLES TAKEN FROM THE VICTIM. 14 15 **(3)** (I)INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE REPORTING SYSTEM IS 16 NOT OPEN TO PUBLIC INSPECTION. 17 THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME PREVENTION, YOUTH, AND VICTIM SERVICES MAY DISCLOSE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE 18 19 REPORTING SYSTEM ONLY TO: 20 1. - 26 (C) (1) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME PREVENTION, YOUTH, AND
- 27 VICTIM SERVICES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MARYLAND SEXUAL ASSAULT
- 28 EVIDENCE KIT POLICY AND FUNDING COMMITTEE, SHALL ADOPT ANY
- 29 REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
- 30 (2) REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF CRIME

Article – Public Safety

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- 9 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 10 (2) "Forensic laboratory" means a facility, an entity, or a site that offers or performs forensic analysis and is owned or operated by the State, a county or municipal
- 12 corporation in the State, or another governmental entity.
- 13 (3) "Fund" means the Rape Kit Testing Grant Fund.
- 14 (4) "Law enforcement agency" means the Department of State Police or a police department of a county or municipal corporation in the State.
- 16 (b) There is a Rape Kit Testing Grant Fund.
- 17 (c) The purpose of the Fund is to provide law enforcement agencies with funding 18 to pay for testing of sexual assault evidence collection kits by forensic laboratories.
- 19 (d) The Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, 20 and Victim Services shall:
- 21 (1) administer the Fund:
- 22 (2) establish and publish procedures for the distribution of funding to law 23 enforcement agencies;
- 24 (3) ensure each jurisdiction in the State that has a forensic laboratory is 25 able to access the Fund;
- 26 (4) consider the number of sexual assault incidents that were investigated 27 by a law enforcement agency in the prior fiscal year when distributing funding; and
- 28 (5) submit a report with information on the distribution of funding to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, before 30 September 1 each year.

- 1 (e) (1) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of 2 the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 3 (2) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the 4 Comptroller shall account for the Fund.
- 5 (f) The Fund consists of:
- 6 (1) money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund;
- 7 (2) any interest earnings of the Fund; and
- 8 (3) any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit of the 9 Fund.
- 10 (g) **(1)** The Fund may be used only for equipment, supplies, personnel, and 11 outsourcing necessary for the testing of sexual assault evidence collection kits in forensic
- 12 laboratories.
- 13 (2) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE FUND
- 14 MAY BE USED FOR EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, PERSONNEL, AND OUTSOURCING
- 15 NECESSARY FOR THE TESTING OF SEXUAL ASSAULT EVIDENCE COLLECTION KITS
- 16 COLLECTED BEFORE OR AFTER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FUND.
- 17 (h) (1) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same 18 manner as other State money may be invested.
- 19 (2) Any interest earnings of the Fund, including interest earnings under 20 subsection (f) of this section, shall be credited to the Fund.
- 21 (i) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the State 22 budget.
- 23 (j) Money expended from the Fund for testing of sexual assault evidence 24 collection kits is supplemental to and is not intended to take the place of funding that 25 otherwise would be appropriated for testing of sexual assault evidence collection kits.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2023.
