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Hospitals – Overdoses – Testing for Fentanyl <u>(The Josh Siems Act)</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring the emergency department of a hospital to conduct a rapid
include testing for fentanyl as part of a urine drug test for fentanyl in patients with
a known or suspected drug overdose if a toxicology report is requested by a treating
health care provider screening; and generally relating to fentanyl testing for hospital
patients with a known or suspected overdose.
