- FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Pathway to Nursing Program in the Maryland Department of Health; requiring the Secretary of Health to establish a certain pilot program before implementing the Program statewide; establishing the Maryland Pathway to Nursing Advisory Committee to assist the Secretary in the development and implementation of the Program; and generally relating to the Maryland Pathway to Nursing Program.

- 21 INSTITUTIONS WITH A 4-YEAR DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM, ONE OF WHOM SHALL
- 22 BE FROM A HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY;
- 23 (6) (7) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A PRIVATE HIGHER
- 24 EDUCATION INSTITUTION THAT PRIMARILY OFFERS 4-YEAR DEGREE PROGRAMS;

- 26 ASSOCIATION;

- 13 (D) THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE.
- 14 (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMITTEE.
- 15 (F) A MEMBER OF THE COMMITTEE:
- 16 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE 17 COMMITTEE; BUT
- 18 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

- of this Act shall study whether licensed practical nursing education programs that meet

- 24 eligible for federal and State funding related to apprenticeship programs and report its
- 25 findings and any recommendations to the Senate Finance Committee and the House Health
- and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State

- SECTION <u>2.</u> <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2023.
