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1 (a) This section does not apply to any lump sum payment by the Maryland 2 Department of Transportation made on or after July 1, 2022, and before July 1, 2023, that 3 represents a retroactive salary increase to one or more classes of employees for periods of 4 employment that took place on or before the award of the payment, if member and employer 5 contributions on the payments were made to the State Retirement and Pension System.

6 (b) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this section, Section 1 of this Act shall 7 be construed to apply retroactively and shall be applied to any lump sum payment by a 8 participating employer on or after July 1, 2022, that represents a retroactive salary increase 9 to one or more classes of employees for periods of employment that took place before the 10 award of the payment on or after July 1, 2022, and before July 1, 2023.

SECTION <u>2.4.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
July 1, 2023.
