years old, the first \$15,000 \$20,000 of military retirement income received by an individual
 during the taxable year]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
 1, 2023, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2022.
