BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Health – General Section 19-2106 Annotated Code of Maryland (2019 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 19–2106. (1) A majority of the full authorized membership of the Commission is a (a) quorum.



- 5 (c) A member of the Commission is entitled to:
- 6 (1) Compensation in accordance with the State budget; and
- 7 (2) Reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel 8 Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- 9 (d) (1) The Commission may employ a staff in accordance with the State 10 budget.
- 11 (2) The Commission, in consultation with the Secretary, shall determine 12 the appropriate job classifications and grades for all staff.
- 13 (3) THE COMMISSION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE SECRETARY, 14 MAY SET THE COMPENSATION OF A COMMISSION EMPLOYEE IN A POSITION THAT:
- 15 (I) IS UNIQUE TO THE COMMISSION;
- 16 (II) REQUIRES SPECIFIC SKILLS OR EXPERIENCE TO PERFORM 17 THE DUTIES OF THE POSITION; AND
- 18 (III) DOES NOT REQUIRE THE EMPLOYEE TO PERFORM
 19 FUNCTIONS THAT ARE COMPARABLE TO FUNCTIONS PERFORMED IN OTHER UNITS
 20 OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT.
- 21 (4) THE SECRETARY OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT, IN 22 CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSION, SHALL DETERMINE THE POSITIONS FOR 23 WHICH THE COMMISSION MAY SET COMPENSATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS 24 SUBSECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
