- 3 (I) THAT IS CONSPICUOUSLY POSITIONED IN THE PHARMACY 4 AND READABLE BY PHARMACY CUSTOMERS; AND
- 5 (II) IF APPLICABLE, ON THE PHARMACY'S WEBSITE; AND
- 6 (2) PROVIDING VERBAL NOTICE TO EACH CUSTOMER WHO PICKS UP 7 A PRESCRIPTION OR REFILL.

- 3 (2) AVAILABLE TO A CUSTOMER USING AN ACCESSIBLE LABEL FOR 4 THE DURATION OF THE PRESCRIPTION.
- 5 (F) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2023.
